Clinical Assistant Professor of Instruction & Clinic Director

Department of Communication Sciences & Disorders

The University of South Florida (USF) Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) is seeking a twelve-month Clinical Assistant Professor of Instruction of Audiology. Candidates who meet the preferred qualifications also have the opportunity to be appointed Audiology Clinic Director by the CSD Chair in consultation with the faculty.

The person in this position will primarily be responsible for providing direct clinical services and/or academic instruction such as supervision to Doctor of Audiology students in clinical practice in a university-based, billing clinic and/or developing and teaching graduate and undergraduate courses with a focus in Audiology. The USF CSD Hearing Clinic is located in Tampa, Florida and provides a wide range of adult and pediatric clinical services, including hearing evaluations and treatment (hearing aids, osseointegrated devices, and cochlear implants), vestibular assessments and treatment, tinnitus evaluations and counseling, auditory processing evaluations, and electrophysiologic testing. Additional responsibilities include providing service to the university through faculty governance at the department, college, and/or university level and providing service outside the university to the community and/or profession. Opportunities to advance in rank are available based on experience.

The ideal candidate will be interested in the Audiology Clinic Director appointment. Clinic Director duties will include responsibility for daily clinical coordination and management of the USF CSD Hearing Clinic (5 full-time clinic faculty, 2 providers, and 4 clinical services support staff) as well as the Tampa General Hospital (TGH) Inpatient and Newborn Hearing Screening program (1 full-time provider, 2 audiology technicians), including but not limited to development and management of best-practice diagnostic and intervention strategies, management of supervisor and student schedules, annual billing and coding updates, revenue optimization, initialization and management of credentialing of audiologists and providers, and general clinic management. The Clinic Director will also serve as a member of the Executive Committee and Au.D. Program Admissions Committee. Performance of these additional responsibilities is factored into the applicant's full-time equivalent effort and accompanied by an annual stipend.

The applicant must be licensed to practice in Florida (or have applied for that licensing) before the position start date

- Au.D. or Ph.D. in Audiology, Hearing Science, or related field
- Holds or eligible for Certificate of Clinical Competency (CCC-A)
- Licensure or eligible for Florida Audiology License
- Must meet university criteria for appointment to the rank of Assistant Professor of Instruction

About CSD
